We're Still "Growing" Strong

The District's demographer, Population and Survey Analysts (PASA) has declared that Lamar CISD is the #1 FASTEST GROWING district in Texas. PASA projects there will be 65,000 new housing occupancies in Lamar CISD between January 2021 and October 2031. Of that number, 48,000 will be new single-family homes. Although most of the new housing development will occur in the northwest quadrant of the district (Fulshear-Katy area), the district is still seeing growth in many areas.



PASA also presents a student enrollment forecast report annually. Per the October 2021 report, Lamar CISD is projected to serve more than 72,000 students by 2031. The rapid growth of the student population means the district will need 25+ new schools within the next 10 years.



A Vision to Move Lamar CISD Forward







Over the last year, Dr. Roosevelt Nivens has set forth a vision of continued excellence for Lamar CISD. As the District continues to grow, Dr. Nivens has worked to engage every District and community stakeholder.

During the first week of school, Dr. Nivens kicked off the year by visiting every Lamar CISD campus to encourage campus staff and welcome our students for the new school year. "Aside from our students, our staff is our most vital asset," he said. "I want them to know that I have their back. We are in this together."

In November, the District hosted its first Building Communities Breakfast with city officials and mayors. During this meeting, Dr. Nivens, the Lamar CISD Board of Trustees, and other administration officials met with local municipal leaders to share the current vision of Lamar CISD. Representatives from the 15 municipalities that encompass Lamar CISD were invited to collaborate on future projects. The group also discussed how future growth would impact the local communities that Lamar CISD serves.

As a morale booster, Dr. Nivens worked with the Board of Trustees to approve a surprise incentive for every eligible Lamar CISD employee in December. In January, Dr. Nivens launched his 90 seconds with Nivens internal video feature. The biweekly video campaign focuses on providing words of encouragement to staff members throughout the year. In each feature, Dr. Nivens shares personal experiences and lessons learned to provide insight into who he is as a leader and opportunities for staff to leave a lasting impact on the families that we serve.

To continue the spirit of community collaboration, in the spring, Dr. Nivens hosted a Planning with Parents meeting to establish a clear avenue for communication from district parent advocacy groups. Also, Gather and Grow sessions were held with local religious leaders to strengthen relationships between those community partners and the District.

As the District continues to grow, Dr. Nivens diligently works to ensure that the spirit of academic excellence in Lamar CISD remains strong.

"The size of our District should never dictate the quality of the instruction and services that we provide our students," Dr. Nivens said. "The great work that we are doing now will continue to get better as we keep pushing ourselves and our students forward."

Bond 2017 and Bond 2020 Status Report

In the fall of 2020, the Lamar CISD community passed the largest bond referendum in the District's history at \$666,810,864. While many of the 2020 bond projects have begun, we have many exciting additions to come such as the building of the District's first police station, Gene Tomas High School (#7), Ella Banks Junior High (#7),James Steenbergen Middle School (#6) and Adriane Gray (#32), Willie Melton (#33) and Viola Randle Elementary Schools (#34). The 2020 bond funds also allotted for the purchase of land and buses, campus and facility renovations and technology upgrades.

Additionally, Lamar CISD has completed nearly 75% of the approved propositions from the 2017 bond-many of which were completed under budget. The completed projects include various multi-campus improvements, athletic improvements, Harry Wright Junior High School, Morgan Elementary, the District's new Alternative Learning Center, existing campus additions and renovations, the purchase of new land and more.

"We're so proud to have such a supportive community," Lamar CISD Superintendent Dr. Roosevelt Nivens said. "We're thankful for their commitment to our students and always keep their tax dollars in mind as we navigate our Bond projects. It's important to use our funds wisely, and I'm thankful for a team that shares these ideals and prioritizes being proactive in all purchases."
