SUMMERTIME ENERGY CONSERVATION TIPS!

Summer can quickly become an expensive season, but being mindful of energy conservation can help reduce your electricity bills—and your carbon footprint. Take a look at the following suggestions to increase your energy conservation efforts and beat the heat without breaking the bank.

- COOK DINNER OUTSIDE. Save electricity by using a charcoal or gas grill to cook your favorite summertime meals.
- MODIFY THE A/C WHEN YOU'RE NOT HOME. Adjusting the thermostat—even by a few degrees—when you're not home can conserve a significant amount of electricity.

FARM TO TABLE - LOAM CSA PROGRAM

The CSA is a weekly share of locally, sustainably grown produce delivered to you, and grown here in Fort Bend County. Members sign up online at Loamagronomics.com for a weekly share of seasonal produce and it's

delivered to the community room here at CCR. It's \$30 a week, with weekly recurring payments. Each box contains 8-10 varieties of nutritious, delicious produce. This program is an intimate relationship between the community and the farmer. You will receive a weekly newsletter telling you what's in your box, current events at the farm, storage techniques, member in residence blog, recipes curated by local chefs and invites to member events on our farm. If you are going out of town on vacation or can't pick up your box for whatever reason you can simply login to your account and put your share on hold. It's very flexible, and user friendly. Why register? Not only are you providing your family with a nutrient rich, delicious box of produce, but you are also supporting the growing local food movement in our region. Plus, you'll receive the convenience of having the farm share delivered right here to CCR!

Summer Lawn Care

When standing on your lawn, knowing what is beneath your feet can help you improve the health of your grass.

- The first layer is the grass sod. This is typically a thin layer of soil usually clay, that your grass sod was originally seeded and grown on.
- 2. Beneath your sod is a mixture of the native soil and sand mixed and shaped to help your property drain well during rain events. This is an important layer because that is where your grass roots will grow and seek nutrients and water.
- 3. The base soil is compacted native soil.

A few months after being installed, it is important to address the lack of nutrients and organic material in the second and third layers below the grass sod. The best way to improve your turf is to aerate the lawn by using equipment that creates small holes in the lawn, followed by an application of a top dressing.

Top dressing can either be a top soil enriched with compost, or simply a compost. Aeration helps get water, air and nutrients to the root-growing zone. Adding a top dressing helps get organic material below the sod to feed the grass. The benefit of using an enriched top soil is that you get the added benefit of evening out the surface of the lawn to address uneven settling which is typical during the first year after installation.
