ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS (REMINDER):

The assessments are due on January 1st of each year and provide for services in the community such as code enforcement, upkeep of the amenities (pool, fitness center, sports park, and lakes), and landscaping just to name a few. Every owner has an obligation to pay the annual assessment. Please note, if you do not receive a statement, you must contact C.I.A. Services immediately to confirm your balance and ensure it is paid on time.

Collections Policy: Finance charges are applied on the last day of each month. On February 1st, a \$40.00 late fee is applied to all unpaid accounts. If your account remains delinquent, a late fee of \$60.00 will be applied on March 1st. In April, an attorney will file a Notice of Lien Affidavit and a fee will be placed on delinquent accounts. In May, the Board will consider sending accounts to the Association's attorney to begin legal collections efforts. All costs incurred and legal fees will be charged back to the account.

Payment Plans: If you are unable to pay the full balance by the due date, please contact our office to set up a payment plan of your account will become delinquent. Interest will continue to accrue but the collection steps noted above will be suspended once the payment plan is accepted and payments are made in accordance with your approved payment plan. The Association's Payment Plan Policy is posted at www.ciaservices.com.

MARY'S MEATBALLS

My mother Mary, for whom our restaurant is named and appears in our Logo, was first generation Italian American. Her parents came into the United States through Ellis Island, from Naples, Italy. Growing up in Pittsburgh, our family had many great cooks! But among them all, my mom's meatballs were legendary. In her honor, today I'm sharing her recipe!

1 lb ground beef (93 / 7 ground chuck) • 1 beaten egg • 1/2 C. Good Quality Grated Parmesan Cheese 1/2 C. Bread Crumbs • 1/2 t Salt • 1/2 t Black Pepper • 1/2 t garlic powder • Optional 1/4 C white raisins

Mix all ingredients well, making sure all cheese and bread crumbs are no longer visible. Form into approximately 3" round balls, somewhat bigger than golf balls. To cook, meatballs can either be baked in a 350 degree oven for 30 - 45 minutes or fried in olive oil on the stove. I like frying because the outside gets crusty. Once they've cooled you can enjoy as is or simmer in your favorite tomato sauce. Buon Appetito!!

STRUCTURAL PRUNING OF YOUNG TREES

Most structural defects that occur in older trees can be prevented by pruning when the tree is young. This pruning can avoid the need for more expensive tree care later in the life of the plant and can extend its lifespan by decreasing the likelihood of branch failures. Structural pruning of young, developing trees provides a desirable and stable form at maturity and is one of the best investments that consumers can make in their landscape.

Forest trees tend to develop a sound structure in response to competition. Dominant forest trees tend to maintain a single stem and narrow crown as they grow toward light. Structural pruning vs no pruning- see the difference in these young trees! Conditions are radically different when trees are planted in the landscape. The tree is exposed to full sun, which encourages a broader, more complex crown than one growing in the forest. Lower branches may grow very large, limbs develop in close proximity to one another and multiple stems can develop. Certain species such as maple, elm, ash and dogwood are particularly prone to developing structural defects.

When trees are young, they grow rapidly. Frequent assessment is recommended to determine when pruning is needed to maintain a desirable structure and correct any deficiencies. On many species, pruning is needed every 2-3 years for the first 10-15 years after planting. Structural pruning focuses on maintaining a single dominant stem (unless multiple stems are specifically desired such as birch and crapemyrtle). Branches are pruned so their size remains proportional to the stem diameter at their point of attachment. As trees grow, some branches are removed to ensure adequate spacing between permanent scaffold limbs. The shape of the tree is maintained to provide a natural open grown form typical of the species. In winter, when the branches are bare is a good time to prune trees.

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




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
